#### Scheme of Examinations and Courses of Study for

#### M.A. History Examination

#### Credit and Semester System (CSS)

The Post-Graduate (P.G) Course will be conducted through semester system in which duration of course (2-year) will be divided in 4 Semesters, having 80 credit overall and 1600 marks (1400 marks-theory and 200 marks-Project Work and Dissertation/1120 marks- Written Exams and 480 marks-Continuous Internal Assessment).

#### The division of Semester system will be as follows:

1st Semester - July to December - 20 credits
2nd Semester - January to June - 20 Credits
3rd Semester - July to December - 20 Credits
4th Semester - January to June - 20 Credits

Total credits will be 80 and each credit will be of 15 hours and 14 marks.

The course will be divided into two parts-Core papers and Elective papers/ Choice -based Special Papers. There will be core papers for Semester-I, II and III. In M.A. IV Semester there will be three papers (paper I-III) of specialisation from each of the following groups:

Group-A: Ancient Indian History

Group-B: Medieval Indian History

Group- C: Modern Indian History

The student will have to opt for any one of these groups with due permission.

The fourth paper of the second semester and fourth semester will be a Project Work and Dissertation respectively.

The candidate will be evaluated on the basis of written examination (70 marks) and Internal Continuous Assessment (30 marks). In the written examination, the question paper will have the following format:

Each paper/option will be of maximum 70 marks having three sections.

- (i) Section A will consist of 10 objective multiple choice questions of one mark each. The candidate is required to attempt all these questions
- (ii) Section B will consist of 8 short type questions. The candidate is required to attempt only 4 out of these 8 questions. Each short question, carrying 5 marks, will be answered in 100 words.
- (iii) Section C will consist of 8 long type questions. The candidate is required to attempt only 4 out of these 8 questions. Each long question, carrying 10 marks, will be answered in 800 words.

The maximum marks for Continuous Internal Assessment will be 30. The break up of mark will be as follows:

(i) Assignments (Seminar papers etc.) - 10 marks

(ii) Group Discussion - 10 marks

(iii) Exposure of students/Test - 10 marks
